Excellence in Preservation, Reuse, and Community Revitalization

Restore Oregon is pleased to invite nominations for the 2016 DeMuro Award. Our goal is to recognize historic rehabilitation projects across Oregon that exemplify exceptional creativity, quality, and community impact, and to share the lessons learned.

Eligibility

- Rehabilitation/redevelopment of a structure at least 50 years old
- Compatible new development within a historic district
- Completed in Oregon within the last five years

Criteria

- Highly creative or unique approach to design, adaptive reuse, and problem solving
- Exceptional quality of engineering, craftsmanship, materials, and standards
- Significant economic, cultural, or environmental impact and lasting value to the community

Process

Submissions will be accepted through **August 5th** and are made by completing and submitting the attached form. There is a \$25.00 application fee. Self-nominations are welcome. The panel of judges includes representatives from the architecture and preservation communities.

Award recipients will be notified by October 3rd and awards presented at our gala **Restoration Celebration** on November 11th in Portland. Case studies of the award projects will be profiled on our website and in other materials.
